Literacy

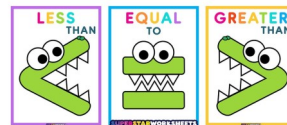
Our Literacy work this week was themed around the Greek myth, "King Midas and his Golden Touch". In this story, King Midas wishes for the magic power to turn everything he touches to gold. The children enjoyed exploring gold sensory trays, gold playdough, and created collages using gold materials. We looked at the characters in the story and used adjectives to describe them. Children also enjoyed thinking about what they would turn things to if they had a magic touch.



Numeracy

This week we began learning about Place Value through a range of practical activities. Children have been learning to:

- Sort objects into groups
- Find one more and one less than a number
- Compare numbers using greater than and less than symbols



Topic

In our Topic, 'People of the Past', we have been learning about the artist L.S. Lowry. Children talked about what they could see in his artwork and created their own version of one of his paintings. We looked at how he was inspired by the city he lived in, Manchester, to create his art. We looked at pictures of Telford and children used charcoal to draw their own picture inspired by Lowry. Children also created fact files using information we had learnt about Lowry.
