We have had a real focus on developing our measuring skills in Maths this week.



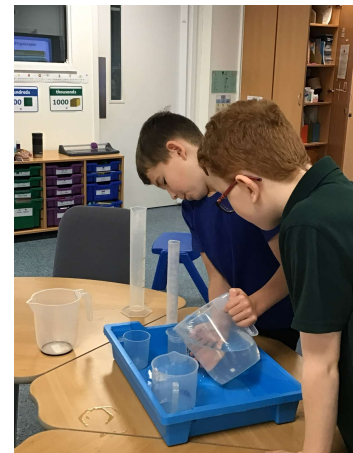
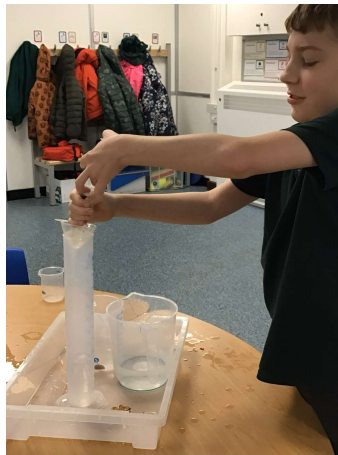
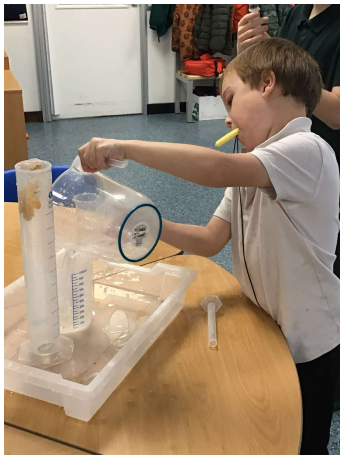
We have been learning how to measure length using a variety of rulers, metre sticks and measuring tapes.

We have used balances to compare and order the mass of classroom objects.

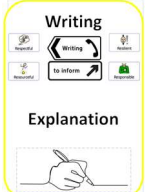
We have also been learning how to read scales to measure mass more accurately.
