



Welcome


Hello and welcome to this week's news from the hub!

Well done everyone!!




This week in literacy, the children have continued to discuss capital letters and their place within the alphabet. We achieved this by identifying upper case letters by their letter names and lower-case letters by their letter sounds. The children then used this knowledge to identify and edit a short text for the correct use of capital letters at the start of each sentence and for proper nouns- names and places.



In maths, we have been using a range of strategies to help us to know and remember more, when working with money. This has helped us to complete our end of unit quizzes with growing confidence.

The children have really enjoyed their Forest school rotation this term. They have shown true resilience when working in very wet and muddy conditions, and they have all grown in confidence when using the rope swing. This week, the children thought about what they had already learnt about birds and what birds use to build their nests. They then thought carefully about what humans would need to build a shelter in the wild, before building and adding to the shelter in Forest school.





This week in art, the children shared their previous knowledge of the three primary colours. They then used a range of media, including, crayons, chalks, pastels and paints to mix and make a set of secondary colours.



This week we have enjoyed following a set of instructions to make our own chocolate biscuits. We crushed, mixed and shaped our mixture to make and decorate biscuits to take home. The children then used this experience to write their own set of instructions, using time connectives.





In Computing this week, the children engaged in a session covering 'Safer Internet Day 2026' with a focus on 'Smart Tech. The children discussed a wide range of devices and technologies used in school and at home. They explored how to use it safely and responsibly and why it's important to **stop, think and talk** to a trusted adult, so they can help you make safe choices when online.
