The purpose of this risk assessment is to support a safe working environment for all children and staff from the beginning of the spring term 2021, while reducing the risk of coronavirus transmission

- For the purpose of this risk assessment, the term 'coronavirus' to refer to coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).
- Staff and unions will be consulted with regard to this risk assessment and any changes to existing COVID 19 risk assessments.
- This should be viewed alongside relevant advice and guidance from the Department of Education and reflect any additional subsequent guidance issued to schools.
- When implemented in line with this risk assessment, these measures create an inherently safer environment for children and staff where the risk of transmission of infection is substantially reduced.
