In Literacy, the children have listened to the poem 'The Nut Tree' by Julia Donaldson. ## Numeracy

In Numeracy, the children have looked at a range of items and have estimated whether they weigh more than, less than or about the same as a kilogram. They have used the scales to weigh items in grams. Some children have continued to learn about 2D and 3D shapes. They have identified some of their properties and have created a tower by stacking 3D shapes.

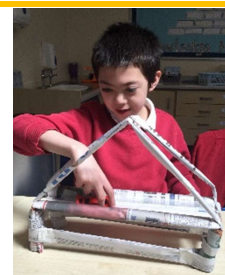


## PSHE

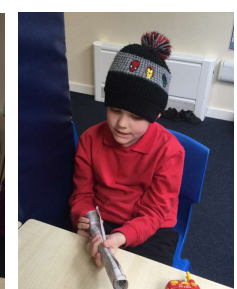
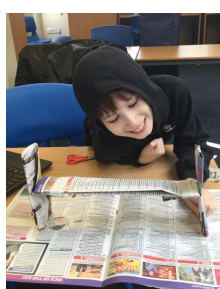
## Topic
