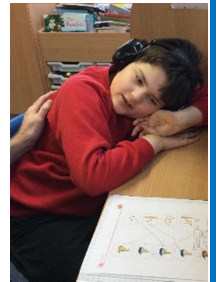
In Literacy, the children have listened to the next chapter of 'The Hodgeheg' by Dick King-Smith. Numeracy

In Numeracy, the children have been learning about fractions and have identified a half of a shape or quantity. Some children have been working hard to tell the time to o'clock and half past the hour. Other children have made observations about size, colour and shape to identify the odd one out when looking at a selection of 2D shapes. In addition, they have matched shapes and rotated them to create pictures of animals and insects.



PSHE

In PSHE, the children have been learning about being a global citizen and the importance of being aware of the wider world and their place in it. The children listened to the story 'The World Came To My Place Today' by Jo Readman and Ley Honor Roberts. They demonstrated understanding and recognised that foods and materials used for everyday products come from all over the world.

Topic

In our topic: Freeze It, the children carried out an investigation to see which materials are the best insulators for keeping an ice cube frozen. They tested different materials including, newspaper, fabric, foil, bubble wrap and plastic. The children made predictions, carried out a fair test and recorded their results.
