



News from the Hollinswood Hub: 13th March 2026


Welcome back to another week of news from the hub. Now that the weather is getting better, we have been doing some of our work outside this week. It's good to finally see some sunshine!

As part of our Geography work, we have been learning about the journey of a river from source to sea. We used our outside area to create a model of a river and then made posters to show each part.




Picture News

Science

In Science, we have been investigating **friction** by testing how far a toy car will travel on different surfaces.



We have found out the rough surfaces produce more friction than smooth surfaces.

We know this because the car travelled further on the smoother surfaces.
