This week has been full of exciting learning and hands-on experiences. In literacy, the children have been exploring how to write letters using the story *Dear Zoo*. They practised using greetings, full sentences, and sign-offs, and wrote imaginative letters asking the zoo to send different animals — and deciding which ones they might politely return.

In maths, the children have been learning about halves and quarters. They worked on splitting shapes and quantities into equal parts and enjoyed lots of practical activities to help them understand what fair sharing looks like.

We also finished our *Green Fingers* topic. The children learned about different climates around the world, how these affect plant growth, and which plants we use for food. They were fascinated to discover how many of the foods we eat every day come from other countries.

Cooking was a highlight of the week as the children made their own flapjacks. They measured ingredients, mixed everything together, and followed each step carefully. The classroom smelled wonderful, and they were very proud of their tasty results.

In forest school, the children worked together to build their own obstacle courses. They used natural materials, tested out their ideas, and supported one another as they tried each challenge. Their teamwork and creativity really shone.
